



WOMEN'S AND GENDER STUDIES

Academics

When you major in women's and gender studies you will study women, gender and sexuality; as you investigate the lives of women as writers and scholars, artists and activists, public figures and private citizens, in the past and the present. You will also study gender more broadly, which means you will look at feminine, masculine and queer identities across time and cultures in order to understand how gender signifies relationships of power.

Your core classes will include Introduction to Women's & Gender Studies; Women, Gender, and Health; Introduction to LGBTQ / Sexuality Studies; Activism and Feminist Communities; Sexuality and Power; Sex & Gender Around the Globe; Feminist Theories, Feminists' Perspectives; and a senior seminar. Beyond that, dive deep into upper-level elective courses like:

- African-American Women's History
- LGBTQ Drama and Popular Culture
- Native American Women Writers
- Women and Politics
- Religion, Gender, and Sexuality
