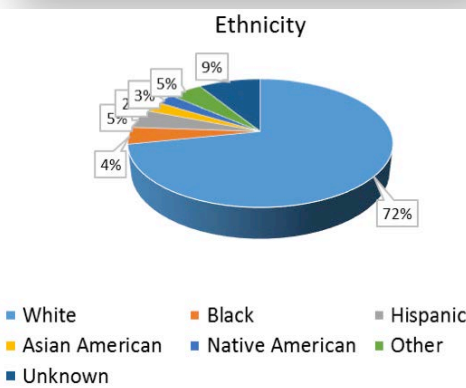
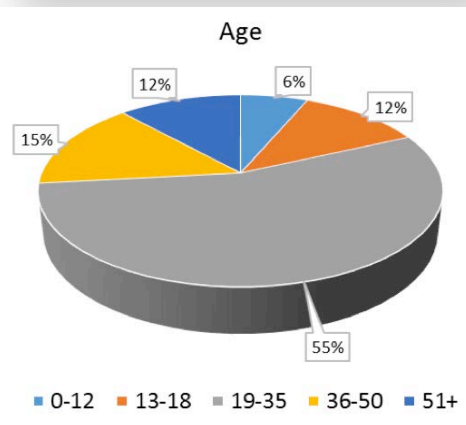
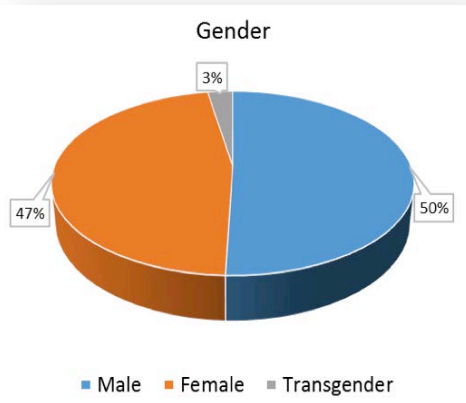
Two New Faculty Join the Program



Dr. Arthur "Trey" Andrews III will be joining the faculty in August. Dr. Andrews earned his Ph.D. at the University of Arkansas and recently completed an NIMH-funded postdoctoral fellowship at the Medical University of South Carolina. His research focuses on understanding and reducing Latino mental health disparities. This includes evaluating treatments that are adapted for improved dissemination among Latino populations. Dr. Andrews also fluently speaks Spanish and will be able to provide bilingual clinical supervision.

Based on the last annual report, the Psychological Consultation Center (PCC) served 188 clients who were seen for an average of 9.7 sessions.



PCC Updates

- The PCC transitioned to electronic record keeping and is now using Titanium Schedule, an electronic medical records system.
- The PCC is fundraising for new audio and video equipment.

Dr. Kathy Chiou received her Ph.D. from The Pennsylvania State University and completed her clinical internship with an emphasis on neuropsychology at the University of Florida Health Sciences Center in Gainesville. In her research, Dr. Chiou uses cognitive assessment and neuroimaging methods such as functional magnetic resonance (fMRI) and diffusion tensor imaging (DTI) to study cognitive functioning and neuroplasticity in adults with traumatic brain injury (TBI). She is specifically interested in understanding how metacognition (the ability to think about one's own thinking) is affected after brain injury, and identifying the neural mechanisms underlying such processes. For her research in this area, Dr. Chiou was awarded the David Wechsler Early Career Award for Innovation in Cognition by the American Psychological Foundation. Dr. Chiou will join the clinical faculty in August 2016, and looks forward to mentoring students in neuropsychological assessment and clinical neuroscience research.

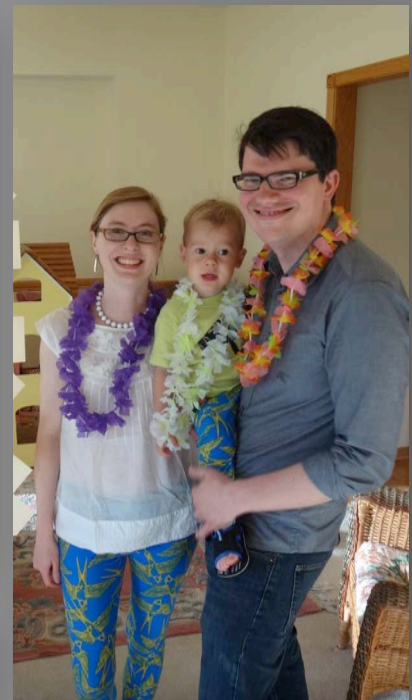
