Disabled College Students 101

In 2019 a group of disabled students took to twitter to ask the question "Why do disabled students drop out?". This comes from a history of disabled college students asking for more support and an understanding of their experiences and culture. In this presentation I hope to give you tools to start to do this by understanding this history and helping you understand more about the disabled college student experience.

Val Erwin is a PHD candidate in Higher Education at Bowling Green State University. She identifies as autistic, dyslexic, and someone with multiple mental illnesses. She has an assistantship as a research assistant focusing on disabled college students. She was formerly the program advisor at the Women & LGBT Center for Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. Her dissertation focuses on how disabled sexual assault survivors experience university response after their assault. Her research in general focuses on how laws and government policies focus on equity are enacted on college campuses, sexual assault on college campuses, and disability. She currently serves as an advisory board for DREAM (Disability Rights Education Activism and Mentorship) a national organization for disabled college students.



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
